Implementation Science in Primary Care Research

Session Description

This Learning Session focuses on Implementation Science in Primary Care research, drawing upon the expertise of Dr. Noah Ivers who is acknowledged as a world leader in providing performance measurement and feedback to clinicians to support quality improvement. He works with a range of clinical experts and broad multidisciplinary teams to systematically develop and evaluate initiatives that improve quality in primary care. We will also hear from trainees who will present their approaches related to implementation science, providing concrete examples for Dr Ivers to guide a discussion on methods and challenges in the field.

Session Objectives

- To review what implementation science is (and why it's important) and common theories/models/frameworks used in the field.
- To explore how implementation science can be used in primary care research, with examples from a Canadian context.
